Vacancies on the Technical Advisory Panel of the Irish Auditing and Accounting Supervisory Authority

The Irish Auditing and Accounting Supervisory Authority is seeking applications from suitably experienced candidates for appointment to its Technical Advisory Panel ('TAP') for two vacancies arising in February 2024.

Role Overview

The TAP assists the Authority's executive in adopting auditing standards and related guidance in Ireland. As a TAP member, you will advise on:

- the annual auditing framework work plan
- draft standards (or amendments thereto), ensuring they are of high quality, effective and proportionate. IAASA's current policy is to adopt the UK auditing framework with changes considered where there are conflicts with Irish or EU law or clear, distinct differences between the Irish and UK market, which impact upon the applicability of standards. TAP members provide input and perspective on such conflicts or differences;
- the development and issue of guidance on the application of standards to support effective application of their requirements in Ireland;
- queries relating to auditing standards that may be referred to it by the executive; and
- the issuing of standards and guidance relating to assurance matters, based on the equivalent UK or international standard.

What are the benefits for you?

- Make a key contribution to the Irish public interest by contributing to the process by which audit, other assurance, and independence standards for auditors are established.
- Engage on issues of public interest with other interested and informed stakeholders.
- Enhance your strategic thinking capabilities and deepen your understanding of standard setting and the Irish auditing framework.

Person specification criteria

We welcome candidates from diverse backgrounds who have knowledge of:

- developments in international auditing standards
- relevant Irish and EU level legal and regulatory requirements at Irish and EU level

The authority is also particularly interested in hearing from candidates who have knowledge of:

- sustainability reporting or assurance
- the work of small to medium audit practitioners

Candidates should also possess significant experience in one or more of the following:

- Standard setting or developing guidance for auditors
- Audit quality assessment, for example, as an audit committee member
- Statutory audits as engagement partner/senior manager
- Education and training relevant to auditing or sustainability
- A relevant academic field

Please note:

- Members are nominated to the TAP in a personal capacity and not as a representative of any organisation or body.
- TAP membership is a voluntary role, with travel and subsistence available in accordance with civil service guidelines.
- The TAP meets approximately four times a year, either in person or virtually. Additional time will be required in preparing for meetings.

- a supporting CV, including relevant qualifications

1. Candidates will be assessed based on the documentation submitted and marked against the specified appointment criteria.
2. IAASA may assess candidates further once they meet the specified appointment criteria by interview, or other method deemed appropriate.
